

Important Information

The following is information to review to see what barriers may prevent you from completing the CDL Class A program. You are required to have your permit obtained before the class starts. You are also required to have completed and obtain your Fed Med Card. Failure to have the permit or the Fed Med card will disqualify you for the class. You can find more information and help with the permit at the following link, as well as find apps to help you with practicing for the exam. The exam is three parts.

About the Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC), Form MCSA-5876:

If the Medical Examiner determines that the driver examined is physically qualified to drive a commercial motor vehicle in accordance with the physical qualification standards, the Medical Examiner will complete and provide the driver with a Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC), Form MCSA-5876. The Medical Examiner will keep a copy of the Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC), Form MCSA-5876 on file for at least 3 years.
